**Breakfast & After School Care:** Breakfast Club starts now from 7.30am. The cost for Breakfast Club will be £4 per morning per child. Breakfast will be served until 8.15am. After School Care will finish at 5.15pm from Tuesday 1<sup>st</sup> March, unfortunately we are unable to keep this going until 5.45pm due to lack of take up for this final half hour.



**GET UP & GO:** If your child comes to Get Up & Go in a morning, please encourage them to wear a sport's top and bring a change of top. Mrs. Hodson has discussed this with the children as we feel that after exercising, and as it is a very active session, some of them may be starting to feel a little conscientious about then sitting for the day in clothes they have been exercising in. Also they are welcome to bring deodorant if they need to re-apply; Mrs. Hodson will make sure they have the time and privacy to do this.

**Pupil Premium Funding:** Due to changing global circumstances many more families are experiencing financial difficulties so qualify for this funding. It is means tested and families are not always aware that they are entitled. Funding comes into school if you are eligible to support your child, and we give this support in many different ways depending on need across the year. Our weekly Fareshare food deliveries means we can also make up food bags to support at home. Food bags will be made up on a Wednesday afternoon and can either be collected from the front door, or if it helps these can be delivered for you if you live in the village and are unable to come to school. If you have siblings at The Infant School food bags can be collected from there if you'd prefer. Please let us know if you would like a weekly food bag making up, if you are able to collect it from school, or if you would like alternative arrangements making for collection. You can do this by either speaking to a member of staff on the gate or by phoning the office and letting Mrs. Ward know.



Please make sure your child comes to school every day with a weatherproof coat, warm hat and gloves. Please make sure they have sensible outdoor shoes/boots on days when they will be learning outside. These should come into school with them in a named bag.

**COVID-19 update:** In line with new Government guidance if your child (children 5 years and older) is in contact with anyone who tests positive please do daily lateral flow tests prior to them coming into school. If the test shows a positive result please keep them off school until day 6/following two negative tests taken 24 hours apart on day 5 and day 6. If your child tests negative in the morning on day 6 and they don't have a temperature then they will be able to come into school

that day. If your child develops any of the three main symptoms, please book and take them for a PCR test, and follow the guidance to isolate until you get the result. I appreciate the changing guidance may be confusing, so please ask if you are unsure. Many thanks for your continued support.
