Dear Parents/Carers,

It is really important that your child(ren) continue to read to an adult regularly, and any time spent at home supplementing the time the pupils spend in school reading will really be of benefit to them. Please continue to sign in your child's diary when you have listened to them read. We will continue to give out reading merits to all pupils who have read at least four times at home each week.

TTRockstars will continue to be available as a resource to help your child learn their times tables facts. If your child is not completely fluent with the multiplication facts up to 12×12 , it is vital that they continue to work through the 'Garage' levels to give themselves the best possible chance of achieving their potential in Maths.
