The most relevant statements for geography are taken from the following areas of learning:

- Understanding the World

		The Natural World	 Know some similarities and differences between the natural world around them and contrasting environments, drawing on their experiences and what has been read in class. Understand some important processes and changes in the natural world around them, including the seasons.

In Foundation Stage 1 (Nursery) children:

- Learn about positional language through a range of stories, activities and experiences
- Understand and follow positional instructions
- Use positional language
- Talk about a familiar route

- Talk about their immediate environment, e.g. in and around nursery
- Learn about different countries and environments through a range of stories, activities and experiences
- Begin to notice differences between their environment and other environments

In Foundation Stage 2 (Reception) children build upon the good practice in FS1 and in addition to these:

- Look at and talk about where they live
- Learn that they live in or near Tibshelf which is a village in England
- Name and locate different parts of the school/Tibshelf
- Find out more about where they live using: photographs, talking to people, maps and going on visits to places
- Talk about different places that they might visit, e.g. the park, the beach, a farm and talk about some similarities and differences
- Explore maps (including signs and symbols) and make their own maps, this could be linked to stories such as 'We're going in a bear hunt
- Explore different places through children's interests, e.g. animals, festivals, birth place
- Develop their geographical vocabulary to include for instance: environment, place, quiet, busy, calm, noisy, old, new, similar, same, different
