OPEN EVENING FOR INFANT & NURSERY PARENTS CARERS. WEDNESDAY 12th OCTOBER, 3.30-6pm. Please note this is an open evening to discuss informally how your child has settled, and not a pupil progress meeting to sit down and talk more formally with your child's class teacher. These meetings will take place later in the school year. To avoid too many people being in classrooms at any one time, please book a time slot below. Appointments can be made for up to five children's parents at a time so you can have a chat and a look around. If your child's class teacher wants a longer/more formal meeting after this, they will be able to arrange it with you then. You are welcome to bring your child with you, but we would appreciate it if other arrangements can be made for younger siblings who may be running around (if at all possible). We ask that you arrive on time for your allotted time slot, and leave your child's classroom at the end of your allocated time to avoid overcrowding. You are very welcome to wander around school; refreshments will be available, along with other stalls in the hall. **If anyone has a small business and would like a stall in the hall, please let me know as soon as possible.**

BREAKFAST CLUB & AFTER SCHOOL CARE: You can book these sessions through School Comms. If you have any problems with this, please let us know by text message or by email. **Sessions must be booked in advance to ensure adequate staffing.**

HARVEST FESTIVAL: We are very much looking forward to you joining us on Tuesday 11th October for our Harvest Festival celebration at the church. There will be two performances, 9.30am and 2pm. Both will include songs, poems and music performed by the children. You are welcome to join us for either or both performances (family members are welcome). After the afternoon performance your child may leave with you, or if they have a club or are in After Care, they can walk back to school with us. Donations of fresh produce, tins or packet foods will be very gratefully received. Fresh produce will be sold before and after the performances, and we will have a raffle at the end of each performance.

STAR ASSEMBLY, FRIDAYS 2.20pm: If your child is chosen to be Worker of the Week you will be notified by their class teacher and invited to join our Friday Celebration Assembly. Please don't worry if you can't make it, they will still be awarded their certificate.

Thank you for making sure your child is in school promptly at the start of the school day. Just a reminder to enter school through the side silver gates and not through the back gates, these are open so you can leave the school grounds without coming back around to the silver gates. If you want to look at/purchase pre-owned uniform this is in the cabin, £2 per item. Also, in the cabin on most days there are items of food (past their sell by date) that are donated by Tesco's – please always help yourself if you can use anything. On a Monday we have a delivery from Fareshare; if your child is in receipt of Pupil Premium funding a food bag will be available for you to collect at the end of the day or on Tuesday morning.

CREATING & MAKING WITH FOOD: Thank you to those of you who have already sent in your child’s baking money. This year we are again aiming to develop a greater understanding of food

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and nutrition across school. Every term all children in school will have the opportunity to create and make something with food and with this in mind **we are asking for a contribution of £3 per child to cover the cost of ingredients for the year.** Please put your child's baking money in a named envelope stating that this is baking money and hand this to your child's class teacher or bring it up to the office. Thank you.

WATER BOTTLES: Please make sure your child comes to school every day with a bottle of fresh water. Please make sure your child gets into the habit of bringing their water bottle home after school so it can be refilled. On the occasions that you may forget to send your child to school with a water bottle you will be able to purchase a bottle from the office at a cost of 50p. If your child needs a bottle of water during the school day Chris will send you a text to let you know one has been given and money is owing. Water bottles should be clearly named so your child can easily identify their bottle. Your child's water bottle should be put in the trolley under where the reading books are stored. You will see it is clearly labelled. **YOUR CHILD SHOULD ONLY HAVE WATER IN THEIR WATER BOTTLE. BOTTLES ARE ABLE TO BE REFILLED DURING THE SCHOOL DAY WITH WATER FROM THE CLASSROOMS, THIS IS SUITABLE FOR DRINKING.**

SNACK: During the morning your child will be offered a piece of fruit as provided through the Free Fruit School Scheme. There is a variety provided during the week which consists of apples, pears, oranges, carrots, bananas etc. as in season. Your child will also be encouraged to drink their water throughout the day.

CLOTHING: Please make sure your child keeps a snowsuit/puddlesuit and wellington boots in school. **Please make sure any uniform your child wears to school is clearly named.** This is especially important for sweatshirts, cardigans and coats. It may be a good idea to attach a keyring with a small figure to the zip pull to help your child to recognise their coat more easily! If your child comes out of school at the end of the day without their cardigan or sweatshirt, please send them back in to collect it – having items named makes this so much easier! Clothes that are left at the end of the day will be hung on your child's peg (if named) or put onto the trolley that is put outside nursery every morning. **Please make sure your child comes to school every day with a waterproof and weatherproof coat. NO SCARVES PLEASE.**

JEWELLERY: CHILDREN ARE NOT ALLOWED TO WEAR ANY JEWELLERY TO SCHOOL. THIS INCLUDES TOY JEWELLERY, BRACELETS, WATCHES (unless your child can tell the time) & EARRINGS (other than plain studs). Please support us with this. Thank you.

HEADLICE: Please make sure you check your child's head on at least a weekly basis. It is really important that you treat your child's head immediately if you find any sign of headlice. You will be able to get further information Facebook @OnceAWeekTakeAPeek

ONLINE SAFETY: Keeping your children safe online in school, and educating them about how to stay safe online at home is a key focus for us.
