


## What does a day at Tibshelf Infant School look like?

Each day is a little bit different, but here is an example of a typical day at our school.



At 8:20, the gates are opened. You then go into your classroom and complete a morning task.



At 8:40, we all go to the hall for assembly. This is usually with Mrs. Banyard



After assembly, we go back to class to do a short carpet input with your class teacher.



At lunch, we eat in the hall. After we have eaten, we go onto the playground.



After this, we spend lots of time learning through play in our environment inside and outside.

After lunch, we go back into classrooms for another short carpet input.



At 3:00, this is the end of the day. We wait with our class teacher to go to our parents.

## How are classes organised?

At Tibshelf Infant & Nursery School, we currently have 5 classes from reception to year 2. We currently have two classes in reception, one class in year 1 and two classes in year 2. Nursery is a separate building within our grounds that has the capacity for 26 children.



As children move through our schools we speak to the children about who they would like to be in a class with to ensure they are happy and confident.



## Lunch times and Snack



Children are encouraged to have a healthy snack. This is offered throughout the morning.

Lunch time is from 11:25am until 12:25pm. School dinners are cooked on site at Town End Junior School by Derbyshire County Council's catering team. Menus are changed three times per academic year, and we send links to these home. They can also be accessed via Derbyshire County Council's website. Meals are also provided for pupils with allergies and dietary requirements too.



If pupils prefer, they may also bring in their own packed lunch. Dinner choices are taken during the register each morning.

## Special Educational Needs



Tibshelf Infant & Nursery School is a fully inclusive school and we take pride in our provision for pupils with additional needs and disabilities. We implement a ‘whole school approach’ to special educational need and disability which involves all staff adhering to a model of good practice. All the staff of the school are committed to identifying and providing for the needs of all children in an inclusive environment.

We believe in early intervention so when we identify a child experiencing a difficulty we work closely with parents/carers to offer support.

We work closely with our local nurseries to ensure that we offer a progressive and supportive curriculum, and ensure we meet and discuss pupil needs before they begin their journey with us. We believe it is important to work collaboratively with families to ensure that children and families are heard and well supported.

Recently, we have worked hard to further improve our provision, creating dedicated areas in school to support children’s sensory and emotional needs. We have our outdoor area, which is used for small group interventions, as well as Positive Play used to support children with their emotional regulation.

## Breakfast Club and After Care

Breakfast club runs from 7:30am each day. Children are provided with a breakfast with a choice of cereals and savoury items. Activities are also set up for children to take part in such as lego, colouring and craft. Breakfast club is charged at £4 per session.

After Care runs in two sessions: the first session is 3:00-4:00, and a second session runs from 4:00-5:00. Children have a range of activities they can complete, as well as time being allocated outside too. Each session is charged at £4 per session.
