- Comply with Safeguarding and Health and Safety systems and expectations
- Ensure they are familiar with the above
- Comply with all requests from staff
- Approach the school to help resolve any issues of concern with regard to theirs or other children.
- Demonstrate that all members of the school community should be treated with respect and therefore set a good example in their own speech and behaviour.
- Seek to clarify a child's version of events of any school incidents with the school's view in order to bring about a peaceful solution to any issue rather than deal with this out of school
- Respectful about our staff, our pupils and other visitors
- Move around our schools safely and with regard for others

- If they see or hear a problem they inform a member of staff as quickly and quietly as possible and they allow us to deal with it
- Dress and conduct themselves appropriately and seek advice where this is unclear

**When visitors are on site we expect that they will all follow this code.**

*A breach of this code may result in stress, worry or other harm to a child or a member of staff or other parents/visitors.*

Remember that a warning letter or even a ban from the school site may also be a consequence of a breach of this code.
